Agenda Item III: Citizen comments on posted agenda items

Agenda Item IV: Bid opening for retaining walls repairs

One bid was received from Geo Stabilization International (GSI) in the amount of \$525,629.88 with the option of sculpted shotcrete facing for \$30-\$40.08/SF.

Motion by Earney seconded by Brommer to present the bid to Council contingent on committee meeting again for presentation from GSI before Council. All members voting yes.

There is some more to do yet for sidewalk/curb repairs. Joe has Semling Brothers Concrete quotes.

Motion by Brommer seconded by Earney to authorize Joe to continue repairs in town. All members voting yes.
